Pastor's Page

Dear Friends at Trinity, when I wrote last month's Tidings article, I assumed that I would be leaving at the end of February when my contract ended. But since Trinity has not yet called a new pastor, I have agreed to stay on until the end of May. I'm delighted to have a few extra months here, but also feel a fresh need for God's grace—for you, for me, and for the person who will come to be your new pastor. And so a favorite verse, a little reflection, a question and a prayer all about "grace".

But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace toward me has not been in vain. On the contrary, I worked harder than any of them---though it was not I, but the grace of God that is with me. Corinthians 15:10 NRSV

The apostle Paul is coming to the end of his first letter to the church in Corinth. In the midst of sharing some profound insights about Jesus death and resurrection, he shares this little bit of autobiographical information.

Paul has come to this point in his life because of God's grace. He has been able to journey this far, to accomplish this much, to preach and teach and travel and write in ways that will change the world forever, all because of God's grace. Paul recognizes that God is lovingly at work in and through him and that single, remarkable fact has made all the difference in his life.

For us, too! It is not just the apostle Paul and the long ago life he led that God was lovingly at work. It is in you and me and everyone who turns to God and trusts him. God's grace is a constant yet unseen force that encourages us when we are lonely, strengthens us when we are afraid, searches us out when we are lost, and draws us ever nearer as we grow older.

We may not always recognize God's grace at work in our lives. But each time we catch a glimpse of it—each time we feel God's Spirit at work in our lives, each time we experience His love reaching through a friend's heart and hands, each time we encounter God's awesome grandeur in the world around us—we can say with the apostle Paul, "by the grace of God I am what I am." And with the apostle Paul, we can know with assurance that that one fact of our lives has made all the difference.

Question: When have you experienced God's grace in your life?

Prayer: Dear Jesus, we praise you for the gift of grace. Help us live this day with a new awareness of how you love and care for us. Amen.

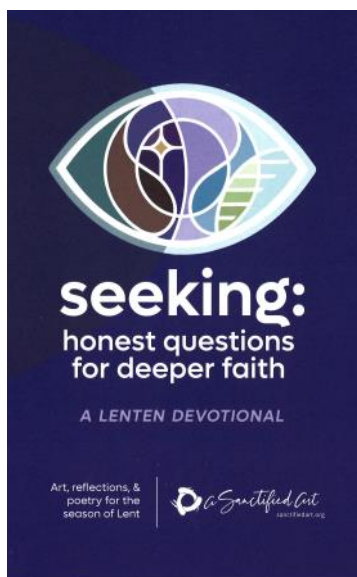

The cost of graves is going up this year. The price will remain at \$400 until the end of May. On June 1, 2023 the price will go up to \$500. This is the first price raise since 2003. Call Julie at 651-674-7047 to purchase a grave.

Cemetery deeds give ownership to the purchaser and their heirs. Heirs can be spouse, parents, children and grandchildren. The owner of a grave can gift a grave to a non-heir. A non-heir would be a friend, niece, nephew, aunt and uncle etc. Gifting a grave to a non-heir will now be charged a \$50 administrative fee for the transfer of ownership.

A Lenten Devotional***

This Lenten season, we will read many stories of Jesus encountering people who are seeking: a new beginning, a different life, a deeper faith. In these interactions, an unveiling often occurs—assumptions are disrupted, a new perspective is revealed, mystery grows.

Seeking: honest questions for a deeper faith, our Lenten Devotional is founded on questions. Some of these questions feel like a charge or challenge ("Who will you listen to?") Some questions are hopeful and curious ("How do we begin again?") Our questions won't necessarily lead to answers, but they can help us find clarity and a new perspective. Ultimately, we pray they lead to a new beginning, a restoration, a wider grace.

Like the characters in our Lenten scriptures, we are also seeking many things: clarity, connection, wonder, justice, balance. We are seeking our calling, the sacred, and how to live as a disciple. We hope that this devotional will help you unpack some of your big questions in ways that are honest and faithful.

This Lent, may you engage in the spiritual practice of seeking—by asking questions and by staying curious and open. May you be drawn more deeply into the fullness of life, into the heart of God.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

Viking Vittles

Viking Vittles is in its 5th year serving food insecure students in our community. During this time, we have been blessed with great support from members of Trinity as well as the greater community. A large part of that support is the result of a \$21,000 grant we received from the City of North Branch as part of the CARES Act from COVID. In addition, in 2020 and 2021 the government provided a substantial amount of food at no cost due to COVID. Because the contribution was a one-time donation, we need to find a way to replace the lost income on an ongoing basis.

Just as everyone else has seen an increase in the cost of groceries, so too have the costs for Viking Vittles risen. The increase in the number of students getting bags of food each week plus the increased use of the care closets at the high school, middle school and ALC has created a significant increase in the cost of this program. Unfortunately, the contributions have not kept pace with the increase in costs.

This is one of very few programs that has zero labor costs; every dollar donated goes to the food that is provided for children in need. While we are continually looking for grants and reaching out to the community at large, we still do not generate enough income to cover all of the costs. Please consider making a one time or ongoing monthly contribution to Viking Vittles to keep this program going. We also ask that you keep Viking Vittles in your prayers as this is a much-needed program in our community.



For many of us, one of the traditions of the Easter season is to give a gift in memory of or in honor of those we love and are thankful for. This is often in the form of a financial gift to our Easter flower garden in the sanctuary. We are offering the opportunity to remember loved ones and in doing so also help those who are in the greatest need. We encourage you to give a gift towards the North Branch Food Shelf this year.

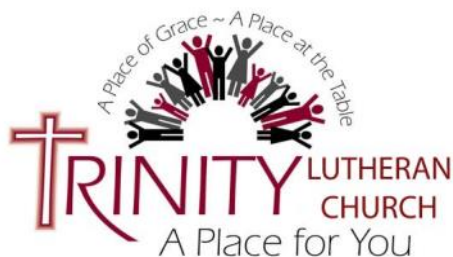

SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE FOR TRINITY'S HIGH SCHOOL SENIORS

Through the foresight and generosity of several members of our church, a scholarship fund has been established at Trinity Lutheran as part of our memorial fund giving. Following are the guidelines for high school seniors interested in applying.

1. The applicant must be a member of Trinity Lutheran Church.
2. The applicant must attend an ELCA affiliated school.
3. The scholarship will be paid directly to the school.
4. The scholarship will be for the graduating seniors in the present year and will be given in accordance with the guidelines of the school which the applicant is attending. If money remains available, it will be offered to students entering upper classes at ELCA schools.
5. Applicants must be full time students. Since each school has its own definition of full-time student, the definition at the school the applicant will be attending will be our guidelines for defining full time student.
6. The maximum scholarship will be \$500 but may be less depending on available funds and the number of qualified applicants. Please note that the number of applicants determine the amount of the individual scholarship award. The decision of the church council is all who apply and meet the guidelines will share equally in the scholarship fund.
7. Letters of application must be received by **May 1st** of the applicant's senior year and be accompanied by a letter of acceptance from the school the applicant will be attending. The letter of application should include the students name, address, phone number, name of school the student will be attending along with a statement that he/she is applying to receive the scholarship award. If the student knows whether or not the school to which he/she is applying has a matching fund plan, this information should also be included along with a copy of the letter of acceptance from the school. In cases where the application is an upperclassperson at an ELCA College, the letter of application must also be received by **May 1** for the following September—May school year. Verification that the upperclassperson meets all the above criteria will be required. A form is available in the church office and on the church website.
8. In the event there are additional moneys available after above criteria has been met, we will accept applications from other members who are students at other Christian affiliated schools.
