If I've learned one thing about Trinity over the past month since I arrived it's this: Trinity knows how to feed people! The other day, I while I was in the office I noticed there was suddenly a lot of commotion going on in the Fellowship Hall. I went and checked it out, and found out that we are doing a whole feeding ministry that I hadn't even heard about - Fare for All.

I'd heard about Viking Vittles, and the care closets already. I was introduced to New Pathways and I learned about the ways we help feed and shelter those families. I had even learned about all the funeral luncheons this church provides. But Fare for All came as a bit of a surprise. I had no idea we were even doing it.

One of those would be enough feeding ministries for many churches, but at Trinity, we do them all. Feeding people is in our DNA. It's a part of who we are as a congregation – and that's partly because it's who God is.

The story of Jesus feeding the 5,000 (our first Gospel lesson in August) is Jesus' only miracle that is recorded in all four Gospels (Matt 14:13-21, Mark 6:31-44, Luke 9:12-17, and John 6:1-14). That in itself, tells you a little bit about how God values the act of feeding the hungry.

Feeding people is such a practical everyday action, and yet as followers of Christ, we know that it's more than that. It brings people together in community. It spreads comfort and love. But most of all, we learn through Jesus that feeding people is holy. It's something that God blesses his whole community through.

It doesn't matter whether you're feeding your family of five, helping to pack Viking Vittles bags, or helping to serve communion. When you feed people, you are participating in the holy work of God.

Viking Vittles

As you read this, we have only a few weeks left to distribute Viking Vittles this summer. Thank you to all that volunteered their time to keep this program operating over the summer.

We were very fortunate to be able to get lots of bakery goods from Family Pathways at no cost that we could distribute to families in addition to the fresh fruits and vegetables we offer during the summer. Family Pathways was closed for about 10 days in July as they completed a remodel. This allowed us to get not only bakery items (and lots of them) but also deli items. Families were very excited for the additional food that we were able to provide at no cost to Viking Vittles.

Our numbers are up from last summer so we are anticipating that the participation once school starts will probably remain close to or increase what it was last year. Enrollment is up at the schools so there maybe significant increases. We are working with the schools to try and ensure we are providing the bags to students that are truly in need.

All students will be getting free breakfast and lunch at school but Viking Vittles provides food for the weekend so that students can come back to school ready to learn.

Because this program costs in excess of \$55,000 per year we are always looking for outside funding. We have had some very generous donations this summer from Midco, Polaris and the local National Wild Turkey Federation chapter. While we are blessed to have a fund balance, we cannot wait until that is gone to find ongoing funding. We are constantly on the lookout for additional ways to fund Viking Vittles. We still have a long way to go to raise enough money to cover our annual costs. In hopes of getting more community support we have created a video that we hope to be able to show at area churches as well as civic organizations and government entities and any place that will have us.

Please keep Viking Vittles and the students that need Viking Vittles in your prayers. Thank you!

Path Hosting

Thank you to all the volunteers who helped with hosting our Path to Home families. With your help, we provided meals and shelter for up to seven adults and seven children every day over a two-week period. Volunteers were not only from Trinity, but also from Kost, Northbrook, and Living Branch Churches. It is so wonderful to see these churches coming together with Trinity to share Christ's love in such a practical way.

We are scheduled to host families again in December. Please pray about what role God would have you play in this vital ministry. Your warm hearts and giving service make a huge difference in the lives of these families. Thank you again.

With your continued donations and financial contributions, we were able to pack 60 Blessing Bags in June for the food shelf and police department to distribute!

THANK YOU!

This fall we are aiming to pack 30 more bags for adults and we will include warm hats and mittens in preparation for the cold months. We are in particular need of warm insulated mittens! Other items that we also need are deodorant, toothpaste, travel size wet wipes, combs, chapstick (you can get a 5 pack generic at Walmart for under \$3), first aid kits (\$1.25 at Dollar Tree), mini flashlights (Dollar Tree), pens, pocket note pads, new decks of cards, 10 oz laundry detergent (dollar stores have those), travel size tissues, snacks (granola bars, crackers, nuts, trail mix, jerky, dried fruits, beef sticks), and single pack instant beverages (coffee, tea or hot chocolate)

We also plan to provide school supplies for our Sunday school children to pack 20 bags for Sunrise Elementary students in September again. Then in December, we will pack 60 Christmas bags for kids; ages newborn to 13, that will be distributed in and around our community. Items we could use for the kids' bags in the coming months are large yellow highlighters, 24 pack colored pencils, and Crayola watercolor paints, bibs, baby toothbrushes and paste, baby shampoo and regular shampoo (doesn't need to be travel size), wash cloths, combs, brushes, hair accessories, kids toothbrush "kits" (\$1.25 at Dollar Tree), toothpaste, and warm insulated mittens.....THANK YOU AGAIN!!
