Come and See!

I saw a study from 2018 about how often regular church goers (attend at least once a month), from different Christian denominations, invite people to church. 71% of Pentecostal and Non-Denominational church goers reported that they extended an invitation to at least one person in the last six months.

For Lutherans? Not so good. Only 55% percent say they invited at least one person in the same time frame. The numbers get worse. 41% of Lutherans say that they had not invited anyone to church in the past six months. Only 20% of non-denominational churches, 22% of Baptists, 23% of Pentecostal churches reported not inviting anyone.

Let's face it: Invitation is not something that we have historically been very comfortable with. There are a lot of reasons for it. We want to respect other people's cultures and customs. We feel awkward. We feel like it might be impolite, or it might make us seem pushy.

If you feel that way, I wouldn't blame you! I often feel it too. But I would also challenge you to think of it from the perspective of someone who isn't invited to something. If you never receive an invitation, my strong guess is that you'll never feel welcome!

Invitations don't have to be difficult. Jesus sets an example of how simple invitations can be in John's Gospel. He invites his first disciples with three simple words, "Come and See." Check it out! See for yourself what this is all about.

You don't have to invite them to worship either (sometimes that can feel intimidating for folks). There are awesome things happening at Trinity all the time! Invite them to something less threatening. Invite a neighbor to come with you to the Lenten Fish Frys! Invite a coworker to come along to help pack Viking Vittles. Invite a friend to join you for the Youth Group lock in!

Invitation can be scary, but it's not complicated. "Come and see!"

Viking Vittles

Viking Vittles was given the opportunity to provide meals from Chipotle to families receiving Viking Vittles. We received a call asking if we would be interested in picking up food from Chipotle as they were training their employees prior to opening. Unable to pass up free food and the opportunity to provide our families with a warm healthy meal was too appealing not to do.

Families were notified of this opportunity via flyers in the bags of food we send home for the weekend. They were required to email us to get a pickup code so that we could control the number of meals being distributed at each pickup time. After the Viking Vittles families had an opportunity to sign up, we still had more meals available so we provided the flyers to the food shelf to hand out to their clients.

We picked up food at 3 p.m. and 8 p.m. on four days. We then brought the food to church and handed it out as families came to pick up. We were never given exact quantities of meals as it depended on the ability of the employees being trained as to how much would be available. Some days in addition to the prepared meals we were given bulk servings of ingredients. We donated this to Phoenix Academy to make lunch for their staff one day.

Some days we picked up way more food than expected so we donated many meals to Lakes Area EMS, North Branch Police, Chisago County Sheriff's Office, residents of Maple Commons, and a group home in town. In all we were able to provide over 500 meals to families and the above groups.

All of this was in addition to our regular packing of 232 bags of food each week plus 56 bags packed at St. John's. We are blessed to have such a fantastic core of volunteers that make sure this program continues to operate like clockwork each week. Volunteers are always welcome!



Thank you to all who donated gifts to 60 local foster children and 20 developmentally disabled adults.

The coordinators of each program were thankful and overwhelmed by your generosity. Thank you for your support of this program each year!

We are looking for more people to help out as ushers at our 10 a.m. worship services, and will also need communion assistants at our 8 a.m. services. We also need volunteers for our


Christmas Eve services. If you are interested in helping out in this way please sign up in the narthex, or talk with Julie or Pastor Paul.
