

Sunday mornings (no judgments here, I'm also guilty!) There has been a huge cultural shift away from "church days." Wednesday nights used to be off limits for practices so kids could go to Confirmation. Sundays were often off altogether.

Today? Nothing seems to be off limits in terms of scheduling. If there is a free night/day/weekend then they will get a tournament or practice scheduled. This shift affects just about every church and youth group in the country and because of that, sometimes older models of ministry don't work they way they used to.

But there are solutions (if you're willing to try new things)! I was speaking with a church member recently who was talking about a congregation they previously attended that had a Sunday night service. Between their kids' and the parents' busy schedules, Sunday night fit their family's needs.

I'm not proposing a Sunday night service, but I do think that's the right way to go about the problem. It's good and necessary to talk about how culture is changing, but it has to move beyond complaining!

The question is, what do you do about it? Or better yet, what does God want us to do about it? Throw a fit? Stomp our feet? Dig our heels in? None of that is likely to help. No, the best we can do as a church, is discern how God wants us to adapt. How is God asking us to renew our minds as Paul says in Romans?

The good news of Jesus Christ hasn't changed; it's a word people still need desperately to hear. But in a world that's changing around us, how do we meet people where they are and provide something that fits in their lives? That's a far more faithful way of responding to the Gospel. We can't transform culture, but God does transform us!





I see all the high school graduates preparing for the next chapter in life, the college students returning for the summer and the newly retired looking forward to that first summer since those high school and college days where a little less is required.



Someone once said change is inevitable. For me that does not mean that change has to be certain.
